Sunday at Sherlock's

Sherlock's Home sponsors a classic car show every Sunday afternoon. Bill Burdick, the Home's owner, calls it BBC for British Built Cars. This is the story of one recent Sunday.

At 4:20 p.m., a bright yellow MGB pulls into the lot. It's Randy Byboth driving wife Cindy's 1980 car. The outside temperature is hovering in the mid-90's and Randy is driving the car in the manner least likely to cause heat exhaustion. The convertible top is up with its rear window unzipped.

Randy dropped Cindy off at the beach up Shady Oak Road a mile or two. Faced with the choice of ogling nubile



young women in revealing swimsuits or admiring 30+ year old foreign autos on hot black top, Randy has picked the latter. His choice is rewarded as he backs into a shady parking spot.

Twenty minutes later, Karl Richter pulls in in his early 1967 Lotus Europa. Karl says it came from the factory trimmed as a racecar but the factory included all the parts to bring it to full civilian spec. 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
vent. He's not dripping with sweat so maybe he's right.

Next Keith and Phyllis pull in with their concours contending 1976 TR6. They're followed closely by Andy Maylahn's red 1970 MGB with a British flag painted on its bonnet. Andy is thinking of doing a full resto on his MGB, but it runs pretty good now so he isn't sweating it.

Then Harvey Bergstrom steers his twowheel conveyance into the lot. It's a 1950 BSA 650, two cylinders and a magneto ignition. Harvey,

who has more of these at home, finds a place in the shade and switches off. The BSA is done in polychromatic beige and it must be one of those light brown moments, because the next vehicle to appear is Dan Wolter's Austin-Healey 100-4 in Coronet Cream. Dan is president of the Minnesota Austin-Healey Club (the only club president to make an appearance today) and did the 100-4's paint and bodywork in his garage last winter. MAHC members recall that Dan practiced his painting skills last year and the 100-4 showed up in a different color each week. While Coronet Cream is not the first color you think of for a sports car (it's not red), the 100-4 has a more purposeful feel in this hue than if it were sprayed in one of the more popular shades (of red). The fold-down windshield doesn't hurt either.

It's almost 5:00 p.m. and Pat Hahn arrives in a maroon 1968 MGB-GT. Pat doesn't have to tell us it's warm inside; we can see the sweat on his t-shirt. Even thought Pat's car is a '68, it's a Canadian spec vehicle so it lacks the Pillsbury doughboy dash of the U.S. cars. Now a lot of cars pull in, Jim Pennoyer's white MGA, a 1978 MGB, a 1966 Morgan 4/4 with the Ford Cortina engine, a 1966 Austin-Healey Sprite named Gerty, a 1985 Morgan +8 recently converted from propane, a 1968 Sprite with the doughboy dash, a 1984



Aston Martin Lagonda, an early Jag XKE, and an early '70's MGB.

People are walking around the lot, some fighting off heat exhaustion with a pint of ale from the pub, looking at cars and telling stories. Curt Carlson relates how his brake line wore through the coil on his Sprite, stopping it in its (diminutive) tracks until he figured out what went wrong. (This is not normally the first thing you check when your car won't run.) Keith Galberth tells folks he's looking for a good (i.e., not rusty) Spitfire. He'd driven down to Willmar yesterday to look at one but said it wasn't what he wanted.

A couple of new Minis arrive, both still wearing their dealer plates. One of them is the rare supercharged "S" model and this attracts a lot of attention. Owner Paul Werdner is finally prevailed upon to give a ride to some of the folks on the Mini S waiting list. Before he leaves, he announces that the Mini's exterior temperature gauge says it's 100° in the parking lot. When he returns, the riders express their enthusiasm for the Mini's (1) air conditioning and (2) acceleration.

Cars continue to arrive, an Austin-Healey BJ8, a series 2 Jaguar E-type, and a 1965 MGB. The latter loses some of its coolant on the blacktop, the first car to do so all day. Some people go in for

> dinner, or to join others sitting in the bar and out of the heat. At 6:00 there are seventeen classic British cars and one classic British bike in the lot. By 6:30 more cars are leaving than arriving although Tom Schramm does pull up in his Mini Moke. By 7:00 there are perhaps a halfdozen cars, and their owners are inside enjoying "bubble & squeak," "fish & chips," or "shepherd's pie."

This Sunday at Sherlock's is over, but there'll be another next week.
