ur Car of the Year award is different than many COTY awards. For one thing, it covers the year past rather than the coming year.

For another it covers every car every made, not the models newly introduced or the models currently in production.

On the other hand, our criteria for the award are extremely specific: Which car did the most to promote vintage foreign cars in North America during 2002?

There were a lot of contenders.



The big Healeys celebrated their fiftieth birthday with over 600 cars at Lake Tahoe. The Triumph TR range also celebrated their fiftieth with 600 cars at Mid-Ohio racetrack. The Triumph wedges (TR7's and 8's) finally seemed to have turned the corner from junk yard dogs to collector vehicles.

Both Lotus and Alfa teased us with hints of

cars that might be sold in the U.S.

The MINI, however, was the car that wowed the masses and brought scores of new people to vintage foreign car events. It started slowly, the first MINIs being purchased by vintage enthusiasts who had stood in line to purchase one. Then, sometime in late spring or early summer, the dam burst.

All of a sudden, vintage events included new people driving new cars.



Tech Tip of the Month



Steve Rixen here illustrates a good reason to clean your battery regularly. Note that one lead from the multimeter is attached to the dirty battery's positive terminal; the other is



on the battery's dirt. The result -- voltage flow through the meter.
