

TR-3A Restoration-Chapter 3

Hello once again! I hope all of you had a wonderful Holiday Season! I apologize for the Holiday Hiatus, and missing the February issue. But, let's get back on track.

Having finished stemming the leak in the front engine seals and putting the TR-3A all back together, I was able to put on many summer miles before the next Major Maintenance Repair (MMR). This was accomplished by basically ignoring the green drops forming spontaneously on the floor at the rear of the engine. My excuse was that I thought it was the petcock at the rear of the block that was leaking.

I have replaced this 3 different times with 3 different petcocks from 3 different catalog companies. All of them leaked. I managed to ignore that the petcock didn't match up with the placement of the spots on the floor for several weeks before I began to investigate. After about 5 minutes of searching, I found some antifreeze at the back of the head. "This does not bode well," I mused! Upon closer inspection, I noticed a frost plug placed at the back of the head in a totally inaccessible spot between the head and the bulkhead. To replace this 95 cent part would require removing the head and replacing all associated gaskets. OK.

I ordered the parts I knew I would need, set up an appointment with Jim at the shop, and took the car there for the teardown. Jim Tranby, the owner of Classic Import Repair was nice enough to let me have some space at his shop while I worked on the TR. I "paid" for this space by doing odd jobs around the shop. Allowing me space at his shop did two things...it allowed me to do the work myself, and yet, I had some expertise at hand in case I ran into difficulties.

After the parts (from the first shipment) arrived, I started disassembling

the motor's ancillaries, the carburettors, manifolds, thermostat housing and various hoses and pipes, to pull the head. It was very straightforward with absolutely no surprises. Well, no surprises except that the head was stuck solid to the block.

There are several ways I have heard of, (but never tried) to break a head loose. One method says pour water into the cylinders, and replace the plugs. Turn over (without starting) the engine and the noncompressibility of the water will lift and separate the head from the block. Another method is to take some cotton rope and feed it into the cylinders through the plugholes, turn over the motor and Viola! The head is loose.



I cannot recommend either of these methods, not having tried them myself. I chose the Owner's Manual recommended "Use lots and lots of penetrating oil and wait for it to break loose" method myself. That did the trick, but took a couple of days. I understand that on the Triumph four-bangers, carbon builds up between the right side rearmost head stud and the hole for it through the head. Once that carbon has been soaked and loosened, the head is easily pulled free. Other than that, it was an easy procedure. After the head came off, it was just a matter of cleaning the block's surface and tops of the pistons.

By this time, I had decided that sending the head to a machine shop was prudent, rather than trying to R&R the frost plug myself. The machine shop would magna-flux the head for cracks and

check the valves for recession. They also check the valve springs for proper tension...all for about \$30. Money well spent. The report back from the machine shop showed that 3 of my valves should be replaced, there were no cracks in the head, and the springs were, well, springy!

With this information I decided all of the valves would be replaced, (as would the frost plug) and I would have them put in "hardened" exhaust seats, thus giving me a "No-Lead Head". Time to order the "second" shipment of parts. While the machine shop was rebuilding the head, it gave me a week to clean up other parts in and around the engine bay. I wire-brushed or sandblasted the intake manifold and thermostat housing(s). Removed and wire-brushed the head studs, and did some general tidying up. I also began the earnest scraping of undercoating in the engine bay. (More about that in a future edition).

When the head was ready it was easy to reverse the teardown and put it all back together. I painted the head, and set the copper sandwiched head gasket in place. From there I lowered the head back onto the block. This is a two-person procedure inorder to not mar the head's mating surface on the studs while positioning it. I torqued the head in place, replaced the rocker assembly, and secured the manifolds. I re-attached the carbs and thermostat housing and replaced the gasket. I also changed the oil, anti-freeze and who knows what else had found its way into the sump. Best just to replace it now and not worry about it. I also decided to drop the oil pan and clean it while checking the bottom end. This also allowed me to eliminate another leak (or two) coming from the pan gasket.

Did it stop the leak? Yep! Does the engine run better? Yep! Am I glad I did the "whole 9 yards?" You bet I am! The total spent for this head rebuild was very reasonable. All together, for all the parts and machine shop labor it cost \$277.65. Oh, and 95 cents for the frost plug!

March Tech Tip

Porsche 944 Water Pump Replacement

Removing the water pump is easy enough. There are 11 bolts holding it to the block. Unfortunately, those 11 bolts are behind a panel, that panel is behind the timing and balance shaft pulleys, those pulleys have belts on them, the belts are behind another panel, and there are 12 bolts holding the panels in place.

Before you get started dismantling this puzzle, assemble your tools. You will need serious sockets (half-inch drive plus breaker bars and cheater), a torque wrench, a couple of special tools (among them the cam belt tension gauge, the flywheel lock,

and the balance shaft sprocket tool for re-

moving the bolts which attach the pulleys),

large gear puller, and the usual floorjack and jackstands.
