# A CLASSIC CAR?

What is . .

*Thoroughbred and Classic Cars*, a British publication, asked this question in their January, 2003 edition. They came to the conclusion that the following ten factors make a classic:

- 1. A prestige badge
- 2. Motorsport pedigree
- 3. Aesthetic appeal
- 4. Exclusivity (but not to the point of uniqueness)
- 5. Desirable when new
- 6. Cultural significance
- 7. Design or engineering significance

8. Driving appeal

- 9. Excellence at what is was supposed to do
- 10. Worth investing time or money in

Of the ten factors, the first three are almost universally accepted. They are subjective, but most people can agree on a rough order for most cars. For example, Rolls-Royce is a more prestigious marque than Trabant, a Ferrari has more of a motorsport pedigree than a VW Beetle, and almost anything has more aesthetic appeal than a Daimler SP250.

The other seven facotrs are ones that Classic Cars developed. Number four, exclusivity, is interesting primarily because of the words in parentheses, "not to the point of uniqueness." If you have the only Piggatini ever built, that's nice and maybe you can sell it on eBay, but you don't own a classic car.

"Desirable when new," number five, is perhaps more debatable since many classics were produced at the end of their desirability, when their systems and designs were beginning to be seen as antiquated.

Number ten is also debatable since it is just another way of asking whether people will pay big bucks for it today. Is Alan Alda's Triumph TR6 a classic car just because you could recover your money from a frame-off restoration by selling it to a MASH fanatic? Or Colombo's Peugeot 403?

Not only did T&CC develop this rat-

ing scheme, but they also proposed a tenpoint scoring system and graded some potential classics on it. See the yellow box. *Inter(Marque (Monthly* will not attempt to defend the scores given by *T&CC* but we do invite you to try the system on your car and see how it scores.

### AMERICA'S IO MOST WANTED FOREIGN CLASSIC CARS?

According to Buy Classic Cars (web site: www.buyclassiccars.com) they are:



<u>1. 1964 -</u> 1973 Jaguar <u>XKE</u>

BCC: "The Jaguar XKE con-

tinued to shoot up in price with a few top notch series 1 examples fetching 6 figures!!" "Although it is still the series 1 roadster that is most desired, series II and III examples have been making more at auction also."

IMM comment: Is this still the Austin Powers Effect (APE)? Probably not because it seems few of the big-buck XKE's (aka E-types or XK-E's) have British flags painted all over them.

### <u>2. 1964 - 1967 Austin-Healey</u> <u>3000 BJ8</u>

BCC: "I w a s shocked w h e n Healeys started to



fetch more money that an e-Type, it just didn't seem right somehow. I mean it is a lovely car and all, but is it really on a par with the incredible XKE?"

IMM comment: The "J" in BJ8 means that it is a convertible, with roll-up windows. Many Healey purists seem to prefer the BN1, a roadster with a roll-down windshield.

### <u>3. 1963 - 1971 Mercedes 230SL</u> and 280SL

BCC: "The 'Pagoda Roof' cars may have finally begun to have come of age. The 190SL have been enjoying a revitalizzed market but last year we found quite a bit of interest not only in the 280SL, but also the 230SL."

IMM comment: These autobahn cruisers are what the Ford Thunderbird always should have been.

#### <u>4. 1965 - 1975 Porsche 911</u>

BCC: "The (Porsche) 356 is now over \$30,000 so early 911 and 912's are a very attractive option."

IMM comment: These are the early 911's, with narrow bodies and without fender flares, whale tails and other disco trademarks. You could get a nice one for \$10,000 a few years ago, but those days may be gone forever.

#### 5. Volkswagen Beetle

BCC: "2003 saw some record prices set for VW's like beetles selling routinely for \$20-25,000 and a 21-window (bus) that sold for nearly \$50,000!"

IMM comment: Most Beetles, even very good ones, "routinely" sell for well under \$10,000. Still, when Citroen 2CV's go for nearly \$10,000 and Fiat 500's fetch \$5,000 on eBay, who's to say a \$25,000 Bug is out of line?

#### 6. 1950-1957 Jaguar XK120-140

BCC: "Jaguar XK120-140's continue to do well, the roadsters are probably in the most demand but DHC and even FHC have changed hands for big bucks."

IMM comment: DHC means Drop Head Coupe (convertible) and FHC means Fixed Head Coupe (hardtop). It's funny that the XK150's didn't make the list.

#### 7. 1969-1974 Triumph TR6

BCC: "If you are into British sports cars this is definitely one car you should consider grabbing before it gets out of reach. I have a sneaky suspicion that this will go the way of the AH BJ8 in time."

IMM comment: Since the editor's spouse is selling her TR6, we are forced to recuse ourselves from any comment on BCC's thoughtful and well-reasoned words.

#### 8. 1956-1962 MG A

BCC: "Many MG A's found new homes in 2003. There seems to be interest in all years from the early 1500's to the last of the MK II."

IMM comment: MG was always the style leader of the British industry and this was one of their best efforts. The funny thing is that it was not well-received when new; many critics wanting an all-new vehicle.

### 9. 1954-1963 Triumph TR2 & TR3

BCC: "With the cut away doors and big two liter motor, you'll leave every MG you see in the dust. Early TR's are beautifully made and a joy to drive."

IMM comment: Despite their lack of rack & pinion steering, these cars are a hoot to drive. A vintage feel but enough oomph to hold their own out on the freeway.

#### <u>10. 1950-1955 MG TD & TF</u>

BCC: "The TD and (to a lesser degree) the TF is still a popular choice among "Sunday Drivers," with such a great club and national parts network they really give you everything you can want for in the vintage car department."

IMM comment: It's too bad that these cars have become "Sunday Drivers."






## Out & About
