

Book Report

I just finished Bugatti Queen by Miranda Seymour. You may have seen it in the bookstores as it's being marketed as a "crossover" book. The publishers hope it will appeal not only to auto/racing enthusiasts but also to a larger female audience. I can't tell you whether Oprah would like the biography, but from

a vintage car enthusiast's standpoint, it's darn good.

The story of Hellé Nice (nee Hèléne Delangle) began in a small French town at the turn of the century. She left home early and moved to Paris to seek fame and fortune as a professional dancer. Before her career took off, Hèléne earned a few extra francs posing for naughty French photographs. (Parental guidance: Naughty pics appears in book.)

In 1920, Hèléne passed her driver's test, used her modeling money and bought a Citroën (probably a

for herself as a dancer, friends took her to Brooklands where they raced their Grégoire cars. Dancing was still her job, but automobile racing became her passion.

By 1929, Hellé Nice (as she was then known) was at the top. Then a skiing mishap damaged her knee and ended her dancing career. She took up car racing full time. On June 2, 1929, she won the Grand Prix Féminin at Montl-héry in an Omega-Six. On June 14, she took the Actors' Championship in a Bugatti 43A.

With the money, she bought a vacht and a Hispano-Suiza. Ettore Bugatti lured her to Mosheim with the lure of a Bugatti 35C in which to challenge the world speed record. In December, she did 197.7 kph (122.6 mph) at the icy Montlhéry circuit. She was, for a time, the most famous woman in France and did a lot to promote the Bugatti "pur sang" marque. Nevertheless, Ettore still charged her 40,000 francs for the car, peeving her no end. (Thirteen years after her 1984 death, this Bug sold for \$486,500, including several of Nice's scrapbooks.)

In 1930, she went to the U.S. and drove the deadly board tracks then popular. She wasn't allowed to compete against the guys so was limited to exhibition laps. She never wore a helmet because the audience liked to see her blond hair. Once, after crashing at some poorly maintained venue, she climbed out from under the car, brushed herself off, and waved her white beret to the crowd. They went wild.

Nice never made it to the absolute top

off on a 1,000 mile tour of France. In

1921, as she was beginning to make a name

took

in European racing. In the early part of the 1930's, she was almost, but not quite, as good as Nuvolari, Chiron, and Etancelin. Very, very good, but not the best. She also offended some people. There was no doubt that Nice was a dedicated and hardworking racer but she was also a showoff. The crowds loved her but competitors like Chiron hated her guts. Hellé also liked men and probably had as many male lovers as Maurice Chevalier or Stirling Moss had females. This didn't go over big in some circles. Especially circles in which her current lover's wife was a member.

By 1935, a major change in international racing was underway. Mercedes and Auto Union, aided by the German government, were pouring huge amounts of money into the sport. The days of the gentleman (and lady) racer were coming to an end. Nice, then piloting an Alfa Monza, could see it as well as any.

She accepted an invitation to race in Brazil and steamed there in 1936 with her Monza and a new lover, a young mechanic by the name of Arnaldo Binelli. On July 12 she competed in the São Paulo Grand Prix, a street race. Spectators lined the course like human hay bales. On the last lap, Nice was chasing a Brazilian favorite for second place. Suddenly, something hit her wheel and the Alfa went into the crowd. She was thrown from the car, landed on a man who died from the impact, and was presumed dead herself with a cracked skull. At least five spectators died and dozens were badly injured.

She returned to European racing in 1937, but was not able to achieve her past levels of achievement. Then the war broke out. She and Arnaldo took up residence in a villa near Nice on the Riviera. When the hostilities ended, she hoped to return to racing, but Louis Chiron (who had hid out in Switzerland during the fighting) called her a Nazi collaborator. There does not seem to be any evidence that she was, but no conclusive proof that she wasn't either. Before long, Arnaldo had squandered their fortune on half-baked get-rich quick schemes. Then he left. Hellé was able to get a few drives, but in Renaults rather than Bugattis. It was a slow downhill road from then to the end of her life.

Hèléne Delangle had an interesting life, but is this a good book? The main problem with it is that so many details of her life are missing. The book's subtitle ("In Search of a French Racing Legend") hints of this problem. Other than that, and the fact that I was always losing track of which point of time was under discussion, it gets five stars.

John Sprinzel at Grand Rapids Vintage Sportscar Rendezvous

Rally great John Sprinzel will be able to attend Rendezvous due to the generosity of event hosts, the Minnesota Austin-Healey Club. Sprinzel took up rallying in 1955 and campaigned prefessionally in Healeys, TR's, MG's, Rovers, Fords, Peugeots, and Saabs. His greatest successes, however, came at the wheel of Austin-Healey Sprites and he also formed the Speedwell tuning firm specializing in Sprites.

Unfortunately rally driving is not as lucrative as Formula 1, so Sprinzel is not a zillionaire. Maybe it was the time he spent as a pro wind surfer at his Hawaii home.

At any rate, MAHC is footing the bill for his transportation to and lodging at Rendezvous. Being a nice guy, Sprinzel donated two of his prestigious trophies for the traditional Rendezvous silent auction. The funds from these two items will go to defray the Healey club's expense in bringing him here.




