#### German cars in 1:43rd scale

With post-war Germany and most of Europe in a state of devastation and ruin in the 1940s, the need for basic and inexpensive transportation was an immediate priority...thus bringing us to the car that we all know and love...the VW Beetle.

This car has many variants, such as the T-1, T-2, Pick Up and Micro Bus models. Also stemming from these are the Karmann Ghias, the 411s and the 412s, Golf, Scirocco, and The Thing.

When it comes to all the variations of this ever so popular car, Minichamps (Paul's Model Art) seem to offer the best detail for the money. Even though they are certainly not the most expensive, the paint finish and attention to detail on the fine points of the car really make these models outstanding.

Rio's versions seem to be quite lacking in these areas, and not worth the few pennies one might save to purchase them.

Other manufacturers such as Vitesse, Detail Cars, and Schuco also put out a nice product. These are priced a little lower than Minichamps also, but for the money, they are still not quite on par with Minichamps.

Minichamps typically limits their production of certain models/colors on certain cars. Often times it is several years before they will then re-introduce the car in a different color. The original Hebmuller Carbriolet in black and creme, for instance, which was the first release is quite rare and difficult to find.

"Chapter 7, Patching Your Own Flat Tires. Anyone who would sit down by the side of the road, dismount a tire from the rim with hand tire irons, patch the tire, remount the tire and then blow it up to pressure with one of those neat bicycle pumps supplied with older British cars just to save two dollars has got to be out of his mind." End of chapter. (Dick O'Kane, How to Repair Your Foreign Car, 1968, Double-day & Company)

Maybe Tom Moerke knows something O'Kane didn't. Like sometimes \$2.00 isn't the issue. Say you're driving your MG Midget up by the Boundary Waters when your tire goes flat. Your spare is back home to make more room in the trunk for your sleeping bag. Your cell phone went out of range three beaver dams back. And you haven't seen another car on the

road in the last forty-five minutes. Then what are you going to do, brother?

Well, if you're Tom you know what to do. First, get the wheel off the car. Next, grab one of those tire irons. (Use a crowbar if you don't have an official British Motor

Heritage tire iron.) Stand on one side of the tire as Tom is doing in the picture. Most wheels have a dropped center. For example, the center of a 15" wheel is likely to be 13" or 14" in diameter. If you can get one side of the tire into that center section, the other side will move more easily.

Insert the tire iron on the opposite side and attempt to get the tire's lip over the wheel. Once that is done, grab your two other tire irons. Insert them and gradually move them away from one another. By the time you've moved each a quarter of the wheel's diameter, the tire should come free.

Remove it and find the spot where that pocupine quill caused the flat. (If you're working on a wire wheel, the hole you're looking for is going to be in the inner tube.) Apply whatever kind of rubber patch you've got, reassemble the setup, and get out your pump. Tom says that a 12-volt

pump works much more easily than a hand pump.

# Rally Insider

## by *Ed Solstad*, Alfa and Jaguar Rallyczar

You keep seeing upcoming rallies listed on the Intermarque Calendar but they're mostly sponsored by some "other" club and besides you're afraid that you won't be welcomed, that all of the other participants will be far more knowledgeable, or that you won't have a good time, etc.

Fear not. Dismiss your apprehensions and read on.

When the local chapter of the Alfa club was first formed, we did a number of "follow the leader" tours. We found that there always seemed to be problems that interfered with enjoyment and/or safety. If the leader drove at a reasonable speed and there were more than say a half-dozen cars, the drivers towards the end of the line had to drive unreasonably fast after each stop sign in order to catch up. Sometimes there were drivers in the group that tended to follow too closely— the last thing that one wants when taking your favorite car for a drive in the country away from all of the city traffic. If the leader had to stop for any reason, everyone had to stop. If one of the followers that was out of sight of the leader had to stop, the leader would continue on oblivious to the fact that someone was missing and probably didn't have a set of instructions to keep them from becoming hopelessly lost. All in all, not a good scenario.

What to do? Our solution was to get into entering and writing local rallies. During the ensuing almost twenty years, we've learned a lot about what works and what doesn't in today's environment. We look at rallies as an excuse to drive our cars in a reasonably brisk but safe manner on some of the best sports car roads in the Midwest. On our events you'll travel on roads that you never knew existed and be secure in the knowledge that they'll go through, that you won't get lost, and that you'll really enjoy the drive. And, hey, you'll have a set of route instructions that you can take out and use later to run the same roads at

your own speed and make all of the interesting wayside stops that you didn't make the first time around.

But don't rallies involve convoluted instructions and complicated time, speed, and distance calculations? Not anymore. In order to encourage participation, we've strived to make rallies as user friendly as possible

Instructions are straightforward, either

written out or in the form of "tulip" diagrams which consist of drawings of intersections as seen from directly above. We want to keep you on course. In order to discourage latent "follow the leader" tendencies and still keep the event

user-friendly we use "Monte Carlo" style timing. We give you not only mileages for all or most of the instructions, but also the mileage and arrival times for the checkpoints.

While that all sounds as if there is no longer any type of challenge, it doesn't work out that way in practice. We time in 1/100ths of a minute. Checkpoint mileages are given in truncated tenths of a mile with many checkpoints being located around corners or over the crests of hills. At those locations, you know that the checkpoint is coming up but you can't see it and it could be anywhere between 12.00 and 12.09 miles into the leg.

OK, so I understand that I should have no problem staying on course, how do I deal with arriving at the checkpoint on time? You'll either be given the amount of time to cover each section or leg of the rally plus, as above, the distance in tenths to the checkpoint. On some events as an aid to helping you determine if you're roughly on time, you'll be given the time at which you should be at various points along the leg. Either way, drive at a rea-

sonably brisk speed to a point ½ mile from the checkpoint and then pull over to the side of the road. Wait until a minute before your ideal arrival time and drive in at 30 mph. You want to be slightly ahead of ideal time since you may or may not be able to see the checkpoint location very far in advance. When you see the checkpoint, coordinate your approach by speeding up or slowing down so that you pass the checkpoint sign at the top of the appropriate minute for that perfect score of zero.

With just a bit of practice, you can do well at this. Michael Barone and Lise Schmidt have won Monte Carlo style rallies in their

> Citroën 2CV with a speedometer reading only in whole kilometers!

> Sounds pretty straightforward, do you have any other helpful hints? Preregister if possible, especially if a set of general instructions is available ahead of time. Use the Rally Check List. Arrive at registration early in order

to have as much time as possible to ask questions. Don't take the event too seriously. You're out to have a good time. The primary goal is to have an enjoyable day and that means staying on course. If you're off course, you'll end up late or maybe even lost. While the navigator reads the route instructions, staying on course is a shared responsibility. Both of you will occasionally make mistakes. Don't make a big deal of this if you want the same partner in the future. When Pat and I rally, there are the ones that we do well at and then there are the learning experiences. OK, some of the learning experiences involve dealing with whatever instruction or timing weirdness that we've sometimes been subjected to. (There is no one more critical of someone else's rally than another rallymaster.)




