Hosting the Triumph Club's January Tech Session was a fun task.

Background on the car: I purchased this '64 Triumph Spitfire in 2008 as a work in progress / Craigslist special. The previous owner assured me that, "yeah buddy, it's all there. You just need to piece it together and you'll have a great classic." The engine was on a pallet and many of the parts were in boxes. Me being a naïve Iowa boy with a trusting soul, bought the car and immediately towed the car body to a painter with a small "one man shop" for an estimate. I liked his estimate and again with my trusting soul, put a large down payment on the bodywork yet to be completed. Can you say, sucker? Well, almost a year later and no bodywork started, I pulled the car out of that body shop, and fortunately retrieved my down payment after a couple nicely written demand letters.

The car made it's way back to my garage where it would then sit for another year. I started the frame off restoration again in 2010. Hauled the body to a reputable paint shop and restored the chassis myself with help from a mechanic friend. We actually had the engine running and got the restored body back from the painter that winter. Well, life got in the way again with three small kids and a few large house projects. A couple more years went by with the Spitfire just sitting in the garage on the *low priority* list.

In August 2013, I attended the Delano Winery Triumph Club Car Show and finally got motivated to get this car done. Engine running and body mounted, now time for wiring and final assembly. That meant finding all those missing parts, bumpers, windshield, etc.

I joined the Triumph Club in December and attended the first meeting in January. Wow, you guys are passionate about your cars! Before I knew it I had already found one of the last missing pieces of my car thanks to other Spitfire owner Bill Nelson. Pat offered to help me schedule a Tech Session and we got it scheduled for January. Just had to decide, what work to complete.

Tech Session, January 2014: The main goal of this Tech Session was to recruit help installing new seat upholstery and a new carpet kit purchased for the car. I had plenty other tasks to get done, but this seemed to be a manageable goal. I heard we had a couple upholstery gurus in the bunch and I can't thank Joe DeMuth and Roger Kraemer enough for leading the task of the new seat covers. Prior to the session, I had removed old seat covers, scraped old rust off old seat frames and re-painted them so we were ready to go. When those guys arrived, the work started even before the beer was flowing. I hear this is a rarity. Never fear, with more than 12 guys in the garage there was plenty of beer to go down eventually. We had a great lunch and I learned a ton of information from all who volunteered their input. When all was done, we had two seats recovered and 50% of the carpet installed. Overall I would say this was a huge success. My only regret was not getting a group photo of all who were there to help. Quite a crew, thanks guys!








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

Our membership year runs January 1 through December 31.



62nd Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, June 13-15, 2014

The MG Car Club - Rocky Mountain Centre invites you to join us for the 62nd Annual Rallye Glenwood Springs, the oldest continually-held time-speed-distance rally in the United States, on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, June 13, 14, & 15, 2014.

The weekend is a marvelous opportunity, not just for MG owners, but for sports car enthusiasts of every mark (British, American, German, Italian, Japanese) to come together for sunny days, cool nights, and unique events. The fun begins on Friday with a scenic road tour from the Denver suburb of Arvada, touring through canyons and over mountain passes in the heart of the Rocky Mountains to the scenic resort town of Glenwood Springs. Added this year is a concurrent tour, the Western Slope Tour. Saturday's main event is the Rallye Glenwood Springs, a time-speed-distance rally to challenge both novice and experienced rallyists. Spend the day winding through the beautiful mountain valleys around Glenwood Springs. The weekend culminates with a social gathering Saturday night and the Car Show, Funkana, and Awards Presentation on Sunday.

Since its inception, the MGCC-RMC has sponsored the Rallye, which began when a hardy group of sports car owners discovered the joys of motoring in Colorado in MGs that still had drop-down tops and running boards (see photo). The Rocky Mountains of central Colorado, with some of the most breathtaking scenery in America, formed the backdrop for the Rallye Glenwood Springs through 61 previous years. Vintage and classic cars from as far away as California and Illinois have shared the twisting mountain roads with their newer counterparts for octane-related festivities. And enthusiasts have come from as far away as England to drive their sports cars through such fabled Colorado mining towns as Leadville and Aspen on their way to Glenwood Springs.

Registration is only \$45 for all the driving events and the car show (before May 15; social event and regalia are extra).
