

PREZ RELEASE

Our cars are getting older-somewhere between 35 and 65 years old by my calculations. In many cases things that could be a safety issue, things that just happen with age and miles, have gone undetected. In the last month I heard of a rear hub breaking on a TR6, leaving them in the ditch. Luckily no serious injuries to the occupants but quite a bit of body damage to the car. The lower front suspension failed on a TR250. This was noticed while in the parking lot, so no accident here but it could have been worse. A couple more--a rear trailing arm broke loose from the frame on a TR6 (in the ditch it went), and a broken U-joint on a rear axle of another TR6 required a tow truck.

With this in mind the Tech. Guys have arranged for a special club sponsored tech session. This is an opportunity to not only check out the lights and turn signals but to get your car up on a hoist and take a good look at things, possibly accidents waiting to happen, before you hit the road this fall. The plan is to inspect only, no actual work will be performed, allowing time for everyone to use the hoist.

Gary Stephenson has volunteered his garage and hoist for this event and Pat Holt is developing a vehicle inspection check list. The session is scheduled for Saturday the 16th of August, starting around 10:00 and lunch will be provided. Complete details will be emailed to members by the Tech coordinator.

If you can't make the tech session, stop by your local garage and have a check up before you get out there in the traffic.

Our membership year runs January 1 through December 31.


