

The end of the driving season for my Triumph and the beginning of my two-year tenure as your Triumph Club President. Who am I? I won't get into the philosophical debate about that question (having been a Philosophy major at the U of M, Morris). The existential answer is that I am currently one of two Jon Meier/John Meyers's in our club. That is why I sometimes tag my messages as Jon/Jack to avoid confusion as which of the two yahoos I am. John Meyers is the proud owner of a TR4, TR6 and TR8. I, Jon Meier, am the one from the poor side of the tracks and only have one Triumph, a 1958 TR3A.

I joined the club in the Spring of 2011 after having purchased my TR3A from Wilson Motors in Washington, Missouri in April, 2011. The purchase was somewhat of a leap for faith since I had not sat in a TR3 since I had sold my last TR3A in 1969. That Triumph was my year-a-round ride while in college. I convinced my wife Jody that it would be a "great Adventure" to fly to Missouri and drive the Triumph back. She didn't realize that I would be anal and not put the side curtains on even when it was snowing. However, being the good spouse I did purchase a wool blanket in the Amana Colonies in Iowa to help(?) keep her warm. Outside of the snow and a blown radiator hose it was a fun "great adventure".

Now having driven my last 2016 Fall run to the High Tea hosted by Gary Stephenson and Barb Wrede, it is time, reluctantly, to put my Triumph into its Winter Cocoon. What the heck is a car cocoon. The following is a link to a Hemmings article which describes it. It is a high-tech way to cover your car for indoor storage.

The Classic Car Cocoon is a different type of car cover, which takes the form of a sleeping bag. For optimal results, you line the garage floor (in my case, a concrete slab) with an oversized section of thick polyethyl-

ene plastic or cardboard, which will act as a vapor barrier to keep moisture from rising under the base layer of the car bag. You then drive your clean, dry vehicle onto the thick woven vinyl bag base, pull the breathable cover (optionally lined with soft fleece, as here) over the car and zip the bag shut. The thing that sets this product apart and makes it high-tech is the special middle layer of Cocoon material, which is impregnated with Vapor Corrosion Inhibitors (VCIs). These compounds were developed for military, NASA and electronics industry use, and are said to chemically bond with all metal surfaces to prevent future corrosion, even in harsh environments. This will be my sixth Winter using my cocoon and it has held up well and worked great.

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## My Life with a TR3A

My story begins when I was 10 years old, early 60's. That is when a saw my older brother pull up in front of the house, after driving this small 2 seater, home on leave from the Pensacola Florida Naval Air Station. Yes it was a black 1959 TR3A. I immediately fell in love with that car, (along with the German Sheppard he brought home for me.) That visit (leave) was the only time I saw that car, but I remember thinking it was the coolest thing ever.



Fast forward to 1969, yes, I bought one. A black 1959 TR3A while I was a senior at Edison High School in Northeast Minneapolis. That car carried me through graduation, Technical institute training, engagement, my first (and only) career job, and my first three years of marriage. Sadly, needing much work, I put it in storage, with the intention of rebuilding it in a few years. 1973 it was retired.



A few years later, OK 30 years, I started tinkering with it, committed to start the rebuild process. That's, when I joined the Minnesota Triumphs Club, and met wonderful Triumph owners, willing to assist me. Lhad my first tech session (a Saturday where club member

wonderful Triumph owners, willing to assist me. I had my first tech session (a Saturday where club members come to your house and assist) that year, and we actually started it up. In the 10 years to follow, I had a few more tech sessions, removed fenders, doors, hood, trunk lid etc. to assess the amount of repair was and if it was repairable.



Truthfully, there were a few in the club that thought it was beyond repair. I admit, I probably would have too, except I had grown attached to the thing. After all it already had deprived me a garage stall for thirty years, leaving me to park my driving car outside. I started the rebuild process, which was painfully slow, getting only 5-10 hours a month on the thing. In 2013, my wife suggested I take it somewhere to be worked on. I'm sure she did some calculations (on the rate I was progressing) and determined we would not live long enough to see the thing on the road.

To cut to the chase, (or is it too late already,) with the help of several club members, I brought the body and tub to a body man for the restoring and refinishing of the body in the fall of 2013. He turned out to be a miracle worker, restoring parts that had rusted away decades earlier. In the winter of 2015, I got the call, the body was done.









The Summer of 2015, body parts started returning home.

In the spring of 2016, when the weather warmed, the reassembly of the car began. Joe DeMuth, and Greg Gelhar suggested a weekly schedule, which transformed into an ongoing Wednesday session from summer into the fall. Many, many people came and helped bring the car back to life. Along with Joe and Greg, Steve Shogren became a regular, as well as Terry Neuman, Bill Nelson was there often, Pat Holt came when work allowed, John Kallaus, and I know I'm missing some. The point being the Minnesota Triumph Club has so many wonderful and gifted people, willing to help and share their knowledge, I can't thank everyone enough.

On every Wednesday, at the end of the session, I had the task placing orders needed parts, for the next weeks session, maybe some cleaning or painting of parts to be readied for assembly. The UPS driver and I met many, many times at the end of the driveway as he made his weekly delivery.

October 5<sup>th</sup> 2016. The 1959 TR3A coughed and sputtered and came to life. 43 years after entering storage, it was reborn. Sure the hood was off, the grill taped in place and no windshield, but my face hurt from smiling so big as I drove it up and down the street for the first test drive. A couple weeks later all those items were installed and Wednesday crew proudly retired. Again thank you to all who shared in this adventure.


