# Wilwood Disc Brake Upgrade

After driving the mountain roads of Colorado for a few days last fall, fully loaded with luggage and a passenger and (Virginia isn't exactly a heavyweight), Joe (Joe Bisanz) decided that an upgrade to the stock TR6 braking system would be a nice improvement. We all know that Triumph cars have had disc brakes up front for a long time however they just don't compare to the modern four wheel systems out there today. We decided to take a look at the Wilwood system that Richard Good of Good Parts Inc. has engineered to fit the TR6. Richard has quite an extensive line of parts that he has engineered to improve handling and performance for the TR6. The setup we decided to use has four piston calipers up front and disc brakes in the rear with drilled and slotted rotors all around. Stainless steel wrapped flexible brake lines were also specified. This set-up allows you to retain the original master cylinder with solid pedal feel and travel for everyday driving.

The installation was quite straight forward. Richard has a very good detailed set if instructions and photos that you can actually clearly see. All the components were separately packaged and clearly



marked. Installation of the front system consisted of simply replacing the old with the new taking care to use the appropriate spacer to center the caliper over the rotor.





The rear installation took a little bit longer but was certainly not difficult to accomplish. The 5/16" studs that secure the rear hubs to the aluminum trailing arm are replaced with 3/8" studs for added strength. I found that it worked quite well to use a 5/16" reamer rather than a drill bit to size the holes correctly for the 3/8 "tap. Take special care to have the reamer properly aligned perpendicular to the mounting surface when doing this. Note: A drill bit tends to grab and screw itself into the already threaded holes in the soft aluminum. After reaming the holes, they must be tapped and then bottom tapped to allow



the studs to fully bottom out in the holes. The next step is to enlarge the holes in the hubs to 13/32" to allow 1/32" clearance for the mounting studs. Now you are ready to reassemble. The studs are installed in the trailing arm with medium strength locktite. Then Good Parts disk brake carrier and the hub is installed and secured with 19 pound-feet torque. The rotor is temporarily secured in position with a lug nut while the parking brake caliper and the rear brake caliper







The next

step is to route the steel brake line from the flexible hose mount to the caliper. I thought this might be a little tricky to do but it went quite well. The brake line was easily bent to shape with bare hands to make the connection, no tubing bender required, and the instructions have a photo of the routing for the tube.

There was a little mix up when we ordered the system. It wasn't made clear that we were going to use the stock steel wheels and there was interference between the rear wheel and caliper. Good Parts



supplied A 3/8" spacer and longer wheel studs that solved the problem. not needed if using alloy or wire wheels.

The spacer is

The next step is to bleed the system, install the road wheels and follow the procedure to properly bed the brake pads and rotors but that will have to wait until spring when the roads clear.


