

I read an interesting article in the March issue of **CLASSIC**

MOTORSPORTS entitled <u>Fuel</u> <u>Facts</u>. They postulate that one of the attributes of high-octane fuels is that they are more stable when it comes to storage. 87 octane fuels tend to be less refined and contain more unstable hydrocarbons which, within months react to form gums, varnishes and lower octane hydrocarbons. They start to degrade in 3 months. 93 octane fuels are more refined and contain more stable hydrocarbons which

can last 2-3 times longer than 87 octane fuel (around 9 months) before degradation is noticeable. Therefore, other than cost, there is no downside to always filling up with premium. Additionally, premium fuel can help to clean the fuel system because it contains cleaner components than 87 octane fuels. Higher octane fuels are also more resistant to engine knock than lower octane options. Racing fuels are a different animal. Where street fuel is blended to meet a price point, race fuels feature even better ingredients which lead to an even longer shelf life. 


give up on me - I'm go'in to beat this thing"..
