Meet Red 14

Like most every boy growing up in the 1960's, I would watch road racing on Wide World of Sports and dream of driving a race car and the boy inside me still has that desire. Over the last several years I have shown race prepped Triumph TR4's that were for sale to my wife and got a resounding no every time but never a, "you will never have a race car", so the hope was alive. Last July, a very well prepared TR4 came up on BAT and I slid the computer over to my wife and showed her the car. To my surprise she said "go ahead and bid on it". After picking myself up off the floor, I immediately signed in to BAT and got my first bid in on Red-14. To my surprise, a few days later, I won the auction! I was a race car driver in waiting. After collecting myself for about 30 minutes to contain my excitement I called the seller, Bob B., to make arrangements. He was so happy when I told him I would drive from St. Paul, MN to Austin, TX to pick up the car. He was so pleased he could "introduce me to the car".



That's when I knew I had just bought a car that wasn't just flogged on the track but loved and cared for in the shop.

We arrived at Bob's house on a Friday afternoon. Walking down the driveway I noticed a TR6 under a cover, another good sign. We immediately felt comfortable with Bob as we went through the bin of 3-ring binders detailing the parts purchased, maintenance preformed, and detailed race weekend records. But inside I was chomping at the bit to see the car. It was at his son Greg's house a few blocks away. We arrived and were greeted by Greg, his wife, and his children as this was a family affair. In the garage under cover next to a Mini was the TR4. I could see now this wasn't just any old transfer of cash for a well-used car. Bob and I slowly rolled the cover off the car together revealing just what was listed in the BAT photos. A well kept car with a few bumps and bruises proving it had been around the track a few times. I slid into the seat and Bob walked me through the starting sequence he went through - relaying the expected oil pressure on the guage as well as the accusump, and how he would warm it up before heading off to the grid.

At that point I was ready to load it up, but he wanted me to take it for a rip around the neighborhood to make sure I was happy with the car. She fired right up and settled in to a **lopey** idle at 2000 rpm. I backed it out, eased up the drive being careful not to kill it and look like an amateur and took a rip around the block. I have a Porsche 996 C4S that is a blast to drive but the raw feeling of the torquey Triumph 4 cylinder above 4k in a car under 2k pounds is like nothing I had driven before. I couldn't wait to get this on a track. I drove it right on the trailer leaving no question as to my decision to purchase. After strapping it down, Greg asked about parking the car at the hotel overnight as I had an open trailer and he offered to keep it in his drive till morning. We then took a tour of Greg's shop and looked at his TR3 racecar and other projects and before we knew it an hour had passed. We took care of the paperwork and as we were finishing up, they asked us what we had planned for dinner. We were planning on eating at a Mexican spot near the hotel and they said that it was their favorite place to eat and invited us to join them. We had a long enjoyable dinner and discussed cars, racing, kids, and life. The food was great and the company was better.

In the morning when we arrived to retrieve the car, Bob was there taking some pictures and saying what he thought was his last goodbye to Red-14. After 10 years of ownership starting when he turned 65, I would become its new caretaker in the year I would turn 65, a most fitting coincidence. Some tears were shed as we left the drive but the story was not over. To be continued...

The day before the Color Tour provided a traditional British atmosphere, cloudy, cold, rainy and wet roads. As the cars started to roll into the parking lot for the Tour, the clouds had moved on, the sun popped out and even a few brave drivers were top down at the start. After a short meeting, we headed out in two groups for the day's adventure.

After maneuvering through stoplights in Plymouth, we headed west on tree lined County Road 6. Our first turn put us on Willow Drive, where trees glistened in the sunlight as we cruised past the rolling horse farms of Medina. As Willow ended, we headed west on Hamel Road past famous Greg Lemond's European country home along Baker Park Woodlands. Next was a short visit



through the town of Loretto, with a slow down over the bumpy train tracks and heading north across Highway 55. After the left turn onto the newly paved Pioneer Trail, we slowed to admire one of the most magnificent colorful trees along the route. Huge and perfectly proportioned it provided an incredible site. Continuing along the newly paved road led us to the Town of Rockford, with the Crow River on our right and the woods of Lake Rebecca Park on our left, we pulled into our first stop. We had a bathroom break and few car photos taken then we headed on our way. A quick right turn onto Farmington Ave, over the south fork on the Crow River the tree lined road offer some fun curves for all to enjoy. Crossing over the north fork of the



Crow River we headed west, and then north through the roundabout and into the town of Buffalo. After navigating a left hand turn at the stoplight, we cruised around Buffalo Lake, some rolling hills, several small lakes and ended at the stop sign looking at Lake Ramsey. A quick pass through another roundabout and the town of Maple Lake, and then a turn to the west brought us to the east end of Clearwater Lake. The trees reflecting on the calm water were beautiful. Passing along the shores of Pleasant Lake and the streets of Annandale, we ended up at the Municipal Park. Fortunately, being Triumph owners who are always prepared, there was a backup porta potty to the rescue.

We exited the town of Annandale to start the final leg of the tour. A quick cruise around the west end of Pleasant Lake, across the bridge over the Clearwater River we rolled along through the woods on the west end of Clearwater Lake. Heading west we entered the Town of Fairhaven, crossed the Clearwater River again, and made a slight turn to the south. The farther south we went the more trees we encountered. A quick right onto Peloquin Ave started our drive around the 900+ acres of Stanley Eddy Memorial Park. The woods were created in the early 1900's by the Eddy family for their nursery. Moving along slowly on the west end of Lake Sylvia, the trees were stunning. It made you want to stop and just look in every direction. We continued to the west around the far side of Eddy Park.
