Race Car History

Have you ever wondered how many owners your TR has had and where it has been? I sure did when I got my race car. I figured it had been turned into a race car in some guy's garage in the mid 70's at the time when Paul Newman was tearing up the track in his TR6. Maybe it then blew up and languished in a barn somewhere till the owner got tired of looking at it. Back then, the landscape was littered with small tracks across the country and local SCCA clubs were thriving with loads of local club racers. I went to my first road race at Brainerd with Bob Lee in 1978. I drove my 72 Spitfire up and camped at the track. It was a raucous crowd that bordered on mayhem and I had a blast. That was where the spark was lit in my mind to race on a track someday.





When I finally got my car last summer, referred to as Red 14, its history given to me began in 1993 when it was sold to a gentleman in Florida with 4 truckloads of parts, as a rolling chassis with a roll cage. It was then traded to Wire Wheel in Vero Beach as an unfinished running ,driving project for a Daimler Dart in 2007. From there it went to Newport Beach, California where it ran races at Buttonwillow, Las Vegas, Willow Springs, and Route '66 from September 2008 through March 2009. It then went to Texas where it raced from September 2009 till 2021. He raced it 33 times which included 2 Kastner cups.

I was at the Chicago British swap meet in March of this year talking to a friend that had raced a TR4 in vintage. He had

restored his car before racing it and asked me if I had found the roll bar inspection hole with the corresponding number. I had not looked because I didn't know about it. I went home and proceeded to find the hole and started scraping away several layers of paint to reveal the numbers 054-082 just above the hole. The numbers 054 are the region of the SCCA the car was first registered. Region #54 is the North East Oklahoma Club (NEOKLA) and 082 would be the 82nd rollbar they certified. The club started in 1957 so I figured the car started its racing life pretty early on.

I then went online and discovered many old SCCA records were kept at the International Motor Racing Center (MRC) at Watkins Glen. Looking at the files I could see they had newsletters from the NEOLKA Club from the early 1960's. I contacted them and there were several mentions of a Vick Campbell racing a TR4 starting in 1963 till 1966. I then contacted the current president of the NEOKLA club only to find out the log book archives had been lost when someone skipped town but at the monthly meeting some old timers had memories of Vick and the TR4.

I followed up with the MRC and they forwarded me copies of the newsletters pertaining to Vick Campbell. He was from the Tulsa area and won many regional events and went to the runoffs in 1965 with the TR4 but had a DNF. My excitement was growing. Could this be my car? The next step would be to track down Vick or find someone that knew him.

When I arrived at Eagles Canyon to compete in my first race of the year, I relayed all of this information to Bob K, a fellow racer from Texas I had gotten to know. Bob has owned 2 TR4's with considerable race history and knows many people that have been around the sport for some time. He emailed a friend John L that lived and raced in the Tulsa area in the 60's. John replied with a long narrative of the racing scene that existed in the Tulsa area from 1963-66 that included his friendship with Vick Campbell and included 3 pictures of the car. In the black and white pictures, you could see the car is red or green and it has a white or yellow roll bar. I got more excited because I found yellow paint underneath all of the other coats of primer and red paint. The curve of the roll bar hoop was also as close as it could be in looking at the pictures. I think this is the car Vick Campbell owned and raced but more research is needed and I will dig till there is nothing more to dig up. I would love to piece together the whole story from start to finish.





The mission was to install the "magic clutch kit", sold by the Roadster Factory, into a 1975 TR6. Brett had meticulously prepared the car by removing the required interior items and placing the car on roller dollies. Removal of the transmission went pretty much as planned. However, once the transmission was removed it was discovered that someone had welded the clutch fork to the clutch shaft. Employing an angle grinder quickly eliminated this obstacle. Next, the various components of the "magic clutch kit" were installed to the flywheel and the bellhousing without much fanfare. Installing the transmission back into the car was a group effort. With the many sets of hands pushing, lifting, prying and pulling, the transmission begrudgingly fell into




place. Bolt up of the transmission to the engine was as much fun as usual. Either you could see the bolt holes but not reach them with a bolt in your hand. Or you needed a third hand to hold everything in place. But persistence paid off and everything went together with no extra pieces left over. Rare, authentic Ansa exhaust for 1972-1976 TR6 (Ansa part# TR0840). Twin down pipe, two mufflers/two resonators with 2 3/8" slash cut, chrome plated quad exhaust pipes. These are one of the last sets acquired before Ansa discontinued production (again) a couple of years ago. Less than 500 miles, like-new condition. They will fit fine over rear sway bars. Note they are significantly louder than stock, but these were attached to a high performance motor with aftermarket, free flowing, ceramic coated headers. They won't be as loud with a stock motor/exhaust manifold, but will still be louder than an OEM muffler. \$450 firm.
