Cruise Control For Your Classic Car - Pat Holt

Last summer at Elsie's Saturday breakfast, one of the regulars was showing us his very nice MGB-GT, and lo and behold, he had an aftermarket cruise control. I asked where he got it: Dealer Automotive Services in Hopkins. https://dealerautomotive.com/ This reminded me that several Triumph club members were jealous of the Neumans, who drove on cruise to the VTR national meet the year before in Oklahoma.

When I called Terry about the CC, he told me he bought it from the Cruise Control Store on the internet. His unit stopped working around Kansas City, on the way back from Oklahoma. He said that I could have it because he had already ordered a new one. The speed



Minnesota Triumph club were finding that the best price to buy cruise control systems was at Dakota Digital in Sioux Falls.


Here's where things take a twist. I was helping Roger Kraemer do an engine removal and re-install in his TR8 that had an early generation cruise control, probably from JC Whitney.

Do you want it? Yes.

So now I had two sets, one with a speed sensor for a speedometer cable and another with a drive shaft magnetic speed sensor.

Meanwhile, several other Triumph Club members got their new units from Dakota Digital. They come with speedometer cable speed sensors.

How do you put a modern speed sensor in a 50 year old car? You call a master machinist to cut you an adapter. Problem solved.



Yes, when can I come over? It took a few weeks but when I showed up Terry explained that his problem was the magnet had come off his driveshaft.

I must admit that when I saw all the wires I was intimidated.

Meanwhile. other members of the

Cruise Control For Your Classic Car - continued

Autumn arrived and time was running out to get to Galena, Illinois for another national Triumph meet. Running out of time, Roger was off to Dealer Automotive Services for the professional install. He picked up the TR8 the next day and everything worked as advertised.

This was now going to be my TR4 winter project.

Using parts from several different generations of aftermarket cruise control, I started on my install by offering beer to Terry Newman to come over and get me started.

I have a 63TR4. They have an hourglass frame where the drive shaft runs through a tunnel. The magnetic pickup needs to be ¼" to 1/2" from the magnet. This requires that it be at the front just back of the universal joint. With the rear moving up and down with bumps in the road, there would be changing the distance from magnet and the sensor.

The hardest part of my install was removing the interior to get the transmission cover off. Terry set up the throttle cable while I started on the wiring. After the install, a test drive this spring confirmed it worked. I will be the first to admit that my wiring looks like an amateur did it because I wasn't sure it would work and didn't cut any wires for length. Now that I know it works, I'll trim and heat-shrink the wiring.

I should explain that the new versions of the aftermarket cruise control units use a 12v servo to pull the throttle cable while the earlier ones used engine vacuum. Mounting the controller is also something to be considered. Earlier units attached to the turn signal with slide controls for set, coast, accelerate, and resume. The newer ones use a square controller that will need to be mounted.


