

Going back twenty-five years to 1998; Minnesota Triumphs were host to the VTR national convention in Hudson, Wisconsin. Gail and I oversaw registration and our fifteen-year-old daughter, Amanda, jumped right in and helped with everything that week. It was her first real contact with the Triumph world, and she decided right then and there that her first car would be a Triumph. It took about two weeks, but she did finally convince Dad and Mom that it was in fact a good idea. Kids can be so convincing. We found a nice 1980 Spitfire, listed in the want ads of the Minneapolis paper, my how things have changed in twenty years. We were able to drive the car home, about fifty miles, and then proceeded to get it roadworthy, new clutch and tires if I remember correctly.





The next summer we were off from Minnesota to the VTR national in Portland, Maine and Amanda and her friend Natty, now sixteen years old, drove the Spitfire without incident, except for a parking ticket in Ottawa. The Spitfire remained with Amanda through high school, college, and on into married life residing in Minneapolis, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kansas and Iowa, a well-traveled Spitfire. When the family became three with the addition of our granddaughter it was time to part with the Spit. Minnesota Triumph club member Gene Kimball purchased the car about ten years ago, so it technically is still in the family.

Amanda and her girlfriend decided to drive up to Minnesota from her home in Iowa and join us for Rendezvous in Ashland ,WI for a weekend away from husbands and kids. After checking out the cars in the parking lot, Amanda came rushing into the lobby to tell mom and dad "My Spitfire is in the parking lot, I know it's mine and it's here in the lot". Gene saw the girls admiring "her car" and an immediate friendship was formed. It doesn't take long to get to know Gene, he is just that kind of guy. Dreams Realized

To start, I need to thank everyone that made the trip to Elkhart Lake to watch the races. One year ago, I bought Red 14 with the dream of entering the Kastner Cup at Road America and that dream was realized and it couldn't have been a better weekend! We counted 22 friends that made the trip, of which most are on the cover photo of Team Red. A special thank you to Joe Bisanz for having the Team Red shirts printed to top it off. I was blown away when I turned around and saw 8 of my smiling friends with Team Red shirts on. From our pit I could look up the hill and see a sea of red shirts sitting together watching the races. I couldn't be more pleased!







Following the May weekend race in Brainard that I wrote about in last month's newsletter, I raced the Father's day weekend at Blackhawk Farms in South Beloit, Illinois. My son was there and noticed how much more my car leaned in hard cornering than the other 2 TR4s on track. I knew things were not as stiff as they could be but when I started measuring the front and rear spring rates, I found the rears were stock TR4 leaves and the front were Roadster Factory uprated street coils rated at 295 pounds. I found a set of 550 lb coils with a 10" free height, the closest to what I needed and after installing, it raised the front by ¾". They did not make a 9" tall spring so I took the lower A-arm and

flipped them over which drops the ride height by a good inch. The front was now about a ½" lower than before, perfect. For the rear leaves, I found no one that made an uprated spring as stiff as I wanted. I had an old pair of springs from a TR4 so I took them apart, cut the mounting loops off each end, and added it to the current springs I had. This stiffened it up but also raised it. I replaced the ¾" lowering blocks with a 1 ½" block to get the ride height correct. Off to Road America with the new suspension, I hoped the balance would be good.



Due to attrition, the original 42 Triumphs entered had fallen to 35 cars. They used my Saturday's best lap time of 3:09.407, not the qualifying race finish to grid us. I was #24 on the starting grid behind a few cars I had passed in Saturday's race. I was right behind the Ambro bodied TR3 driven by Brendan Alexander, his best time had been 3:07.972 but he finished three places behind me. The Ambro has better balance as the engine is moved back in the frame but I have more straight line speed than him. Next to him on the outside was car number 13, a TR4 that had finished 4 places behind me but had a best lap of 3:06.874. I had



followed him during one of the qualifying sessions and he did not follow a traditional racing line and was all over the track. I wanted to get past him as quickly as I could. Next to me on the outside was a TR3, #74 with a 3:09.244 that had finished 5 places behind me in the Saturday race.



My strategy was to use the pearl of wisdom that I had heard from Kastner Cup winning Tony Drews. First lap speeds are much slower so you can wait and out-brake your opponents into the first corner and pass a bunch of them. The theory is great but you need to have the track space in front to get past the other cars. On the start the 74-car got just ahead of me before we crossed the start/finish line and he had to back off as there was no room the squeeze between the Ambro and the 13-car. I stayed close to the Ambro down the straight and through turn one, we gained about 2 car lengths on the 13-car, with the 74 right behind him. Brendan stayed out front on the first lap gaining a few

car lengths but I closed the gap going down Kettle Bottoms and into Canada Corner. I stayed on his tail through turn 14 and passed him going up the hill on the front straight but he came along side me again going down the hill into turn 5 because I had to lift for the #17 Spitfire. I had to go wide and used all the rumble strips but stayed in it and beat him up the hill and under the Corvette bridge. Coming back around into Canada Corner he out-braked me and got ahead but I took him again on the front straight and never looked back. Next up was the that pesky Spitfire. I had used 3 laps to get past Brendan in the Ambro but I was finally feeling more comfortable on several of the faster corners and carrying more speed through them. Turn one speeds went from 57 mph on lap 2 to 68 mph on lap 7. I could see I was gaining on the Spitfire but I only had 4 laps to go. Finally on lap 6 I caught up to him. They weigh 400-500 pounds less so they can go much deeper into the corners before braking. I passed him on the final lap on the straight leading to turn 5 but he out-braked me and passed on the inside. I cut back to the inside going up under the Corvette Bridge and passed him going through turn 6. He stayed close till we got through the carousel but I gained a couple of car lengths by the time we got to Canada corner and I needed that distance as he made up that ground and was on my tail going through the last turn. I gained ground on him as we went up the hill and under the flag stand as the checkered flag was waved. My first Kastner Cup! I finished 22nd out of 35 and was very pleased. 



5 years ago - August 2018
